Aim	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Funding of frontier research in any field of research • Funding of individual researchers (Principal Investigators) and their teams • Funding of researchers consolidating their independent research career
Target group	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Researchers of any nationality and age • 7-12 years after certified successful defence of their first PhD degree (call 2023: PhD defence awarded between 1 January 2011 and 31 December 2015; extension possible in documented cases such as maternity, paternity, long-term illness, national service, clinical training, natural disaster, seeking asylum; special rules for MD)
Time commitment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Minimum 40% on the ERC project and minimum 50% in Europe
Host institution	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Located in EU-Member States or Associated Countries to Horizon Europe
Funding	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Funding for up to 5 years • Max. 2 million EUR (possibly + 1 million EUR for major equipment, access to large facilities, researchers moving from Third Countries to Europe or major experimental or field work costs)
Budget	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 584 million EUR (estimated number of grants: 291)
Application	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Annual call for proposals • One-stage proposal submission • Electronically via the Funding and Tenders Portal
Evaluation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two-stage evaluation process (peer review) • 28 evaluation panels • Interview at the second step of evaluation
Next call for proposals	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Submission deadline: 12 December 2023
